BUSINESS OF THE YEAR AWARD FOR MARINE HARVEST

18 September 2009

Producer of high quality Scottish Salmon, Marine Harvest Scotland, was last night (Friday, 18 September) presented with the 2009 award for Outstanding Business Achievement in the Highlands and Islands, by the Scottish Council for Development and Industry (SCDI).

The award recognises the company's significant positive contribution to the region's economy. Marine Harvest has farmed salmon in the Highlands and Islands since the late 1960s. Today its 23 farms on the west coast, harvest station and processing plant, provide skilled jobs and income for its workforce, which helps to sustain many rural communities.

In 2008, the company won the prestigious account to be the sole supplier of sustainable farmed Scottish salmon to Sainsbury's and sales are already much higher than original estimates. This year turnover is expected to reach around £120m and the company has recently acquired a new site at Loch Lochy which will be Scotland's largest smolt producing farm.

The award was presented by SCDI Highlands and Islands Area Committee Chairman Joe Moore and John Rendall, HSBC's Chief Executive Officer for Scotland, who was also the principal speaker at the event which attracts 350 guests from private, public and third sectors.

Alan Sutherland, Managing Director, Marine Harvest Scotland, said:

"This is a prestigious award and we are particularly proud to have been recognised in our home patch – the original home of fish farming. This is an honour for the company and for the hard working and dedicated staff who grow an outstanding product in the outstanding environment that is the Highlands and Islands of Scotland."

Lossie Seafoods and Blueshell Mussels were also winners in the International Business and Research and Innovation categories, and Joe Moore said that this highlighted that the Highlands and Islands' successes in benefiting from rapidly growing global demand for farmed seafood and was fitting at the end of this year's Scottish Food and Drink Fortnight.

Joe Moore said:

"Marine Harvest has been central to the outstanding achievements of Scottish farmed salmon over the last thirty years. From small beginnings, Scotland is now the second biggest salmon producer in the world. The industry generates over £700m and directly employs 1,500 people, mainly in remote communities in the Highlands and Islands where their income is critical.
